
2016 HIGH SCHOOL FALL 7s



- Live stream of Varsity Boys finals on Facebook






2017 LITTLE RUGBY LEAGUE

- Provo 20 players





2017 / 2018 Club Registration

- Through Utah Youth Rugby only
- \$100 collected at registration is \$150 through USA Rugby
- Registration will open on August 15th
- Club uploads a .eps / pdf (vector files) of club logos



2017 / 2018 High School Team Registration

- Each season will have its own registration
- \$50 per team entered collected at registration
- Registration will open on August 22nd



2017 / 2018 High School and Middle School Player Registration

- \$125 Annual Player Fee Covers both Fall 7s and Spring 15s
- Fee is NON-REFUNDABLE
- Payment plan
 - \$50 at registration
 - \$25 on September 30, October 31 and November 30
- Added club dues are spread over the three payments
- Registration will open on September 1st
- Player uploads:
 - Current school ID card
 - Proof of current school registration



2018 Little League Player Registration

- Player Fee
 - Early Bird \$95 (From January 1, 2018)
 - Regular \$125 (From March 1, 2018)
 - Late \$150 (From April 1, 2018)
- Fee is NON-REFUNDABLE
- NO Payment plan
- Player uploads:
 - School photo
 - Proof of current school registration







General Approach

- One 15s Season for the Boys League (Mid-March to Mid-May)
- League comprises conferences by age divisions 7/8 Grade, 9/10 Grade and 11/12 Grade
- One set of boys policies to govern all conferences in the league
- Team eligibility policies
- Team conference choice with responsibilities
- Player movement allowed but restricted
- Conferences divided into tiers with like teams in roster makeup and strength

- Roster limits
- Play where you live
- Player transfers
- Four conferences



Team Eligibility

- Eligibility for each conference determined by
 - Club status with school if affiliated with a school or not
 - Core school representation on each team roster
 - Club with age based teams 7/8, 9/10 and 11/12
- Red Conference follows USA Rugby Team Eligibility rule
 - Team must be represented by a roster that is limited to: players that are registered students at the High School upon which the team is based including home schooled students eligible for that school's athletic activities
- All other conferences for teams choosing not to be bound by the above eligibility rule



Roster Limits

- Roster limits applied to incentivize formation of 2nd and 3rd (or more) teams by clubs
- Roster limit of 30 players per team
- No more than 10% of players on a roster may be registered at school where that school is a core school for another team regardless of conference
- Enter 2nd team and 3rd teams from a club into different conferences based on the roster for each team
- Teams from a club may combine with other club teams as needed to complete a team or to complete 2nd or more teams
- The new combined roster of the combined team determines conference and tier eligibility



Play Where You Live

- 7th Graders and new players (Grades 8 and up) are required to join the club that
 - Has a team for their age; and
 - 1. That is affiliated with the high school zoned for their residential address; or
 - 2. The nearest to where they live if not zoned for a high school with a team
- Waiver process available if desired
 - Written application required (with a fee)
 - Committee reviewed
 - Approved or denied
- That club becomes their primary home club and remain with that club throughout school career no matter what team they were or will / may be eligible for in the future
- Transfer rules apply after joining primary home club



Player Transfers

- Only one player transfer request available in 6 year period
- Apply by last day of February before season starts
- New players transfer request is considered used whether or not waiver is allowed
- Additional transfers allowed when
 - Primary home club disbands;
 - Player transfers schools; or
 - Player's residential address changes



Four Conferences

- Conferences by roster make up
 - Red
 - Blue
 - White
 - Green
- Each conference further divided into tiers as needed
- Teams move from one tier or conference to another IF they meet the team eligibility requirements for the desired tier or conference



Red Conference

- Team must meet ALL tier requirements to be in one of the following two tiers
- Tier 1
 - Official High School Club
 - Roster 100% from core school
 - Three teams 7/8, 9/10 and 11/12
- Tier 2
 - Official High School Club
 - Roster 100% from core school

Blue Conference

- Team must meet ALL tier requirements to be in one of the following two tiers
- Tier 1
 - Roster more than 50% from core school
 - Three teams 7/8, 9/10 and 11/12
- Tier 2
 - Roster more than 50% from core school

White Conference

- Team must meet ALL tier requirements to be in one of the following two tiers
- Tier 1
 - Roster less than 50% from core school
 - Three teams 7/8, 9/10 and 11/12
- Tier 2
 - Roster less than 50% from core school

Green Conference

- New teams in first 3 years of existence
 - May choose to move to another conference during first 3 years if team roster exceeds 20 players
- Small teams with less than 20 players on roster
- Teams that struggle to form in time each season

League Play

- Conference tiers may not be larger than 6 teams each
- Tiers with more than 6 teams are divided with the higher seeded teams being in the higher tier
- Teams play all teams in the conference tier for division standings purposes
- Teams may play additional teams from other conferences in the same tier to make up 5 league matches if needed for division standings purposes
- All matches in excess of 5 are considered friendlies and only affect overall league standings
- UYR may limit total number of matches per team



State Championships

- Teams in each conferences tiers compete in a State Championship playoff following the regular season
- Losing teams drop down into consolation brackets as needed
- UYR may combine tiers across conferences as needed to form championship brackets of up to 6 teams
- The Green Conference will always be considered a Tier 2 or lower Tier
